

<p>DfE guidelines and Kings detailed provision for remote learning.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Government has made it a national priority that education and childcare settings should continue to operate as normally as possible during the COVID-19 pandemic.</li> <li>• Where face-to-face education is disrupted, the DfE is providing laptops and tablets to schools for some disadvantaged children to access remote education. <b>Kings is part of this programme of ICT provision and parents / carers should notify the College where support is necessary.</b></li> <li>• September 2021 secondary schools, including Kings International College, are fully open to all students.</li> <li>• Shielding is currently paused, with reintroduction only by the national government.</li> </ul> <p><b>Kings International College</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students will be tested twice on site as part of asymptomatic testing before being provided with their home testing kits. Students and staff are then expected to test themselves using the LFD twice a week at home until the government review such procedures.</li> <li>• Those who test positive should isolate, take a confirmatory polymerase chain reaction (PCR) test, and continue to isolate if the result is positive.</li> <li>• Kings students, irrespective of their vaccination status, and double vaccinated adults will not need to self-isolate if they are a close contact of a positive case. They are strongly advised to take a PCR test and, if positive, will then need to isolate.</li> <li>• Kings has put in place high-quality blended learning arrangements so that any child who is well enough to learn from home can do so. We endeavour to ensure that language and instructions are simple and clear.</li> <li>• The College’s contingency plan has taken into consideration staff well-being.</li> <li>• The plan is dependent on all students having quality access to ICT, equipment and learning platforms. Where gaps in resources exist, parents and carers should contact the College so that necessary support can be provided.</li> <li>• The safeguarding and well-being of our children remains our number one priority and any child absent will be contacted regularly by the pastoral team e.g. tutor or Head of Year.</li> </ul>

Key expectations to enable learning & teaching to continue as effectively as possible	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Students will need access to the internet, via a laptop, smartphone or other web-based device.</li> <li>• Families without internet access will be provided a pre-paid Wi-Fi dongle so that remote learning can continue.</li> <li>• Remote learning materials and resources are accessed through the College’s Home Learning tab on the website.</li> <li>• The College will maintain regular contact with parents of an absent child through Edulinkone.</li> </ul>
Safeguarding and pastoral care	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Statutory provision of care will continue to be provided.</li> <li>• There will be a member of the safeguarding team available at all times.</li> <li>• Through CPOMS, all safeguarding entries will be monitored and where necessary, acted upon.</li> </ul>
Our staff will...	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Provide learning activities that will be shared on the Colleges’ website and in the respective year group tab.</li> </ul>
Our students will...	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Complete all work to the best of their ability when well enough to do so.</li> <li>• Continue to use online resources such as Hegarty Maths, Tassomai or other resources provided by the College.</li> </ul>
Required support from parents	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Read all communications that come out from the College to ensure they are fully aware of College news.</li> <li>• Ensure courtesy and politeness to any member of staff within any communication.</li> </ul>
Assessment and feedback	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Assessment and feedback of work will be completed on the child’s return back to school.</li> </ul>
Communication	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The primary platform for communication home will be Edulinkone. Other methods could include phone calls, video calls e.g. Microsoft Teams, email or letter home. If the College deems a child potentially vulnerable and visual confirmation that a child is safe, a home visit following Covid guidance procedures will be made.</li> </ul>
